
All our players played really well and did the club proud and with some players coming into teams at the last minute it really was a great club performance.

Report on finals day,13th of September 2025

Richard had the better start and was seven shots up after 5 ends: from then on, both players shared the points After fifteen ends had been played Richard was still seven shots to the good with a 14-7 lead. Richard then won the next two ends to win the Championship by 21 shots to 7
